Your favor received in my absence on the tract and I regret to say the timber is under option at the moment, at six dollars, I remember however of telling you we would take five fifty about a year ago, and do not find that I have advised you to the contrary, and if we do not sell to the parties now on the ground, will give you a chance to sell at the old quotation.

So far as your associates are concerned we do not know them in this transaction, but we require you to give us the name of the principal before we go to much trouble with them, it costs money to show timber, it is getting scarce and we are offering it at a time when big development is now on the way, and by holding can make more out of it, and must know that we are dealing with parties who can make good if the timber is up to our representations.
