I commence to think we will not see anything of him. his letter was not enthusiastic, I probably made an error in writing Littlefield at all but he sent a registered letter with return card and by answering it I only got into some more correspondence that I could have avoided, am passing it to you for your information.

It has rained every day for eight days now both here and over on the tract, Hansen was in yesterday, and says the ground is mighty wet, and a current running in the sloughs. Roberts and his crew are hunting a way across the first cypress.

Freeman is making better progress and expects to get to the county line in three weeks, we will likely get round to trying out the air drills next week, every thing is out there and can be tried as soon as we can mount the compressor.

Winter visitors are all gone and work is booming particularly at the Beach.
