Dear Captain:

When I wrote you last week, I expected that I would know something definite by this time in regard to what the Bristow people are going to do, but I have not yet had another talk with them. I called up last Thursday night, but Freeland said they had a deal on hand that would take up all their time, and that he had just received the copy of Capt. Cook's report that I sent him and had turned it over to Ed Rolleston for his inspection. He said they would be ready to have a conference some time the early part of this week; so I expect to see them within the next day or two and will then write you definitely, what they decide to do.

I have not tried to make any disposition yet of the \$5000 of stock you gave me, because I understood that you would not need to sell this if the Chatham Bend property is paid for, and I think if the Bristow deal goes through, that Mr. McCord will agree to your suggestion in regard to paying for the Chatham Bend property. At any rate, I will know within the next few days.

What has been done with the Monroe County Commissioners about the ~~bridge~~? Has anything further been heard from McCray in regard to his outfit? Please let me have all late information in regard to the development down there and also instruct me what your wishes are in regard to the \$5000 of stock.
