On receipt of information from the two gentlemen in Washington who I expected to have with me in presenting your matter for approval and corrobor - ated Saturday by Mr. Latimer who was here to deticate the Post Office I have decided it is best not to present the matter until after the holidays. They all say that it is a matter of impossibility to reach at present other than semi - officials because they are all busy in each Department preparing statistics for the President as you will see from the enclosed clipping taken from today's paper.

Mr. Latimer is Secretary to the Post Master General and a friend of mine, and promises me all the assistance I need when I reach Washington, provided I am there after the first of January, the same advice has been promised from the Senators who are expected to be associated with me.

I hate to proceed in the face of such advice and too my health is none too good, however as I have said to you before I'm not going to stand in your way but I am confident that it is best for me to take advice of those that have advised me to delay the matter.
