My dear Captain :

On receipt of information from the two gentlemen in Washington who I expected to have with me in presenting your matter for approval and corroborated Saturday by Mr. Latimer who was here to dedicate the Post Office I have decided it is best not to present the matter until after the holidays . They all say that it is a matter of impossibility to reach at present other than semi - officials because they are all busy in each Department preparing statistics for the President as you will see from the enclosed clipping taken from today's paper .

Mr. Latimer is Secretary to the Post Master General and a friend of mine , and promises me all the assistance I need when I reach Washington , provided I am there after the first of January , the same advice has been promised from the Senators who are expected to be associated with me .

I hate to proceed in the face of such advice and too my health is none too good , however as I have said to you before I'm not going to stand in your way but I am confident that it is best for me to take advice of those that have advised me to delay the matter .
