Dear Mrs. Douglas:-

Capt. J. F. Jaudon asked me some days ago to see you and ask you to sign the enclosed Quit-Claim deed and have Marion Manley also sign the other Quit-Claim deed enclosed. We note your original contract dated Dec. 17, 1924 is made out to you and to Marion Manley. If Marion Manley is a man and is married will you kindly ask that the wife signs also.

Capt. Jaudon advised the writer that you would want to do this in order to put the land in a good legal condition, and he said he would later when the crops come along, pay you something for the quit-claiming back to him. He will do what is right about it.
