I have not as yet received the copy of the proceedings  
of the Commission and your report.

Mr.Ernest F.Goe Executive Chairman was out to see me on  
yesterday; I told him that your and your Committee's decision was  
mine and the interest I represent.

He told me that your report had a recommendation that  
the west line of the park would be some seven miles east/ of  
Turner River; I told him that this was agreeable to me ALTHO  
that I thought if enough money could be assembled to include  
purchases of lands abutting Turner River it would no doubt be  
fine, BUT.that as far as we were concerned"Mr.Copeland's ideas  
were ours."
