I have your favor of the 18th inst. enclosing clipping from the Miami Metropolis.

I am extremely glad to note that Mr. Deane is working hard to get cash for the payment to our company, but I would like very much indeed to know that he is carrying out his agreement to provide a fund for you to start developing on the land which he was contemplating buying. We have had numerous inquiries from the different Vigilance Committees, as to Mr. Deane's responsibility, and other information relative to his undertaking, and some criticism as to the name that he has adopted for this company. At the very start I did not like the fact that the title of this company is so much like that of the Pennsylvania Sugar Company, as it is a means of mis-leading prospective investors. I would like to know what, if any, prospect there is for the starting of the developments which he was to undertake through you and your company. So far he has reported several sales and has sent notes to the First National Bank, but no cash, and, as far as we have been able to learn, no cash has been placed in the bank at Homestead for development purposes. I will be glad for any further information you can give us.
