As you know I have spent a great deal of time and money in research of the possibilities of sugar production on an extensive scale on the marl or "clayey limestone lands" of Southern Florida, I employed some of the best sugar engineers in the world to make me reliable reports, among them being A.G.Greif Vice President and General manager of the Haities American Sugar Co of Hayti, S.Rodman Ginsburg of Romano Central Santa Domingo, A.R.McLane of Ounago Central Cuba (Mr. McLane has handled some of the largest and best sugar plantations in the world, he was with the American Sugar Co. for years, is now in Mexico as Manager of one of the largest plantations in the Republic.

All of these reports were most favorable; to prove them I have a small sugar cane plantation on the Tamiami Trail seventy two miles west of Miami, I have demonstrated that all they said could be done is possible.

We are now trying to finance through Federal Government or private capital a large plantation operation.
