Dear Mr. Price:

I am writing from home due to illness, but greatly disappointed at the failure to get the "drop" on the Chamber of Commerce by having the "News" publish the resolution adopted by the forum.

It appears to me that our opponents have won heavily in the first encounter, although we had every advantage of them, and that if the cause of the Trail by the southern route is to succeed, or even be worth any effort, some swifter course must be pursued.

Have you observed the account of last night's meeting of the Executive Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, contradictory at every point, and believing the truth, but nevertheless totally ignoring the position of the people as expressed at the forum, and going on record as being diametrically opposed to the people's resolution.

I have not one foot of property in the State of Florida west of Douglas Road, and my interest in this matter is therefore purely a public spirited one.

If you have any influence with the "News", there may be some possibility of doing something, but if not, it seems to me to be futile. The account of last night's meeting, if properly picked to pieces would make the Executive Committee a pack of fools, nothing less.

If you could send a stenographer up to my house today, I should be glad to give a news article for the "News" showing up the utter ignorance manifest at last night's meeting. If, however, you have no way of making the "News" stick to the fight it would probably be useless.
