My Dear Mr. Meade:-

As you know I have been associated with the Florida Tomato Deal for more than the past twenty five years; I realize that the trucks and steamships have taken from the Railway Companies a great deal of business which rightfully belongs to the railroads.

We are forming an organization to restore you this business and we desire your help and co-operation.

It is our entention to handle one thousand cars or more of tomatoes from Florida shipping points to New York---and a like number to Chicago----this coming season via railroad transportation.

We expect to take from the field in tomato carriers (loose) graded tomatoes, ship them via railroad to New York or Chicago and grade them there as to color and market condition and deliver to such firms as John Nix, --H.E.Schwitters & Sons, --Robert Cochran Co. et al in New York; or C.H.Weaver Co, et al Chicago for sale.

We will need in New York about 5000 square feet of warehouse space on track of your choice of delivery line (with city truck facilities), and a like space in Chicago.

If you can arrange such facilities for us we can give your transportation line to each point a thousand cars or more exclusively which otherwise would move to market via truck or steamer transportation.

Can and will you meet me at Ochopee or Miami on some agreeable date, or Mr. Coachman or I can and will meet you in Jacksonville at your convenience to go definately into details.
