Collier interests at Everglade, Lee County, Florida, on a dredge that was to be used for the construction of a road from Everglade North to connect with the Tamiami Trail and having commenced such work in November, 1922; affiant further says that while he was working at Everglade the foreman of the work by the name of I. D. Hancock came to him with a petition seeking the creation of Collier County and asked the affiant to sign the same, and affiant stated that he told said Hancock that he was a resident and voter of Glades County, Florida, and that he had no right to sign the petition, and it was stated to him that his name was wanted on said petition any way; affiant further says that he told said person that he did not know anything about the matter and did not care to sign the petition; affiant further says that he was told that the County sought to be created had for its North line a distance of about six miles North of Deep Lake and it would run East ^{2 miles} and then back to the Coast.

Affiant further says that there was working for the Collier interests at Everglade men from Key West, the State of Georgia, and France, all of whom signed the said petition for the creation of said County to be known as Collier County.
