AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO HOUSE NUMBERS IN THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Miami Beach:

WHERIAAS, there is now no accepted system of number-
ing houses on the various streets and avenues of the city of Miami Beach, and the need of a uniform system is recognized by all;

THEREFORE, all house numbers shall be allotted in the following manner, and by the use of the following tables:
SECTION ONE -- AII except the last two digits of the number for the house may be obtained from table.

Houses on the North and Fast side of street are to have odd numbers. Houses on the South and West side of street are to have even number.

There is to be an allotment of numbers for each lot, determined by dividing the front yardage by (25) and using the nearest even division. For example, two numbers would be reserved for a 50 ft. lot : one for a soft lot; three for a 75 ft lot; three for a 65 ft lot, etc.

The location of the house on the lot shall determine which of the allotted numbers shall be used. In case of a 50 if lot, when the house is nearest the south or east line, it shall take the lower of the two numbers alloted to that lot. If the house is exactly in the center of the lot it shall take the lower number, also.
