AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA,
TO PREVENT THE KILLING, TRAPPING OR HUNTING OF
WILD BIRDS, OR GAME BIRDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF
MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of
Miami Beach, Florida.

Section 1. No person or persons shall injure,
kill, hunt, destroy, capture, or molest by any means what-
soever or in any manner or form, within the limits of the
City of Miami Beach any of the following named game birds:
Wild turkey gobblers; quail (Bob-white partridges); turtle
doves; swans; geese; brant; ducks; rails; coots; mudhens;
sand pipers; curlews; snipe and plover, or any of the follow-
ing named wild birds: Rice bird; meadow lark; jack-daw;
crows; cardinal red bird; mocking bird; blue bird; ~~mocking~~
bird; whip-poor-will or other wild bird.

Section 2. No person or persons within the limits
of the City of Miami Beach shall take or wilfully destroy the
nests or eggs of any game birds or wild birds or shall have
nests or eggs of any game bird or wild bird in his or her
possession.

Section 3. No person shall, at any time, in the limits
of the City of Miami Beach, make use of any pitfall, deadfall,
scaffold, cage, snare, trap, net, saltlick, blind-pen, bait-hook
or bait-field, or any similar device, or any drug, poison, chem-
ical or explosive for the purpose of injuring, capturing or
killing any game birds or wild birds.

Any person violating any of the provisions of the fore-
going ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by
a fine not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars nor less than Ten Dol-
lars, or by imprisonment in the city jail not exceeding thirty
days nor less than three days.
