

ORDINANCE #161

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON OR PERSONS DRIVING OR STEERING A VEHICLE OF ANY DESCRIPTION TO PASS A STREET CAR OR STREET RAILWAY CAR WHILE THE SAME IS AT A STANDSTILL FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING OR DISCHARGING PASSENGERS, AND FOR ANY PERSON TO LEAVE A STREET CAR DOOR OPEN EXCEPT WHILE RECEIVING OR DISCHARGING PASSENGERS, AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons driving a vehicle of any description, however drawn, or propelled to pass a street car or street railway car while such street car or railway car is at a standstill for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers.

SECTION 2: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, whether agent or employer, to leave doors of street cars open except while passengers are being actually received or discharged.

SECTION 3: Any person violating this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not exceeding Fifty (\$50) Dollars or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding twenty (20) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons driving a vehicle of any description, however drawn, or propelled to pass a street car or street railway car while such street car or railway car is at a standstill for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers.
