

ORDINANCE NO. 190

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, PROHIBITING THE RUNNING AT LARGE IN SAID CITY OF ANY POULTRY OR FOWL, AND PRESCRIBING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.....

BE IT ORDAINED By the City Council of the City of Miami Beach, Florida:

Section 1: That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation owning or controlling, or having in their custody any poultry or fowl of any kind to permit or allow the same to run at large in the city of Miami Beach, Florida.

Section 2: Any person, firm or corporation violating this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail of Miami Beach, Florida, not exceeding thirty days.

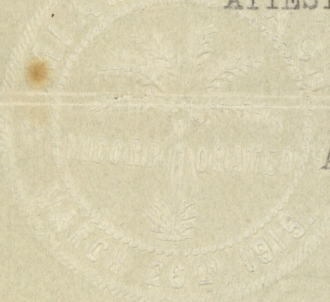
