

ORDINANCE NO. 207

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES IN ALLEYS WITHIN SAID CITY FOR MORE THAN FIVE MINUTES AND PROHIBITING THE OBSTRUCTION OF ALLEYS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park a vehicle in any alley within the City of Miami Beach, Florida, except in the alley between Ocean Drive and Collins Avenue, between First Street and Biscayne Avenue, for a period longer than five minutes or to in anywise obstruct traffic in said alleys.

Section 2. Any such person, firm or corporation found guilty of the violation of this ordinance shall, upon conviction be fined not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars or be imprisoned in the City jail not exceeding thirty days.
