AN ORDINANCE AS TO OBSTRUCTING VIEW OF DRIVERS OR OPERATORS OF VEHICLES AT HIGHWAY INTERSECTIONS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to permit shrubbery or any other growth to grow upon or to maintain the same upon any parcel of land at the intersection of any highways so that the same will obstruct the view of the driver or operator of any vehicle approaching such intersection from another highway.

Section 2. Any person violating the provision of this Ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not more than Two-Hundred (\$200) Dollars or be imprisoned in the City Jail not more than ninety (90) days, and the said City may thereupon enter upon such land and remove such obstruction.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall be effective immediately.
