

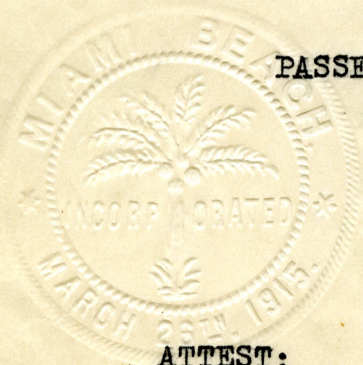
ORDINANCE NO. 237

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That after the passage of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person to take or keep any dog into or upon any public park, beach, or any pavilion or pier in said City unless said dog is under leash and kept under leash at all times while in or on such place or places and not permitted to run loose or at large.

Section 2. That any person found guilty of violating this Ordinance shall be fined not more than Two Hundred (\$200.) Dollars or be imprisoned in the City Jail not more than ninety (90) days.


