
AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE
SPEED AT WHICH ANY BOAT OR
WATER CRAFT SHALL BE OPERATED
IN WATER WAYS WITHIN THIS CITY
AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR
THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI
BEACH, FLORIDA:


Section 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to
operate a boat or water craft within any waterway, except
the Government Cut, within said City at a greater speed
than six miles per hour.

Section 2: Any person found guilty of a violation
of this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$200.00 or
be imprisoned in the City Jail not more than ninety days.



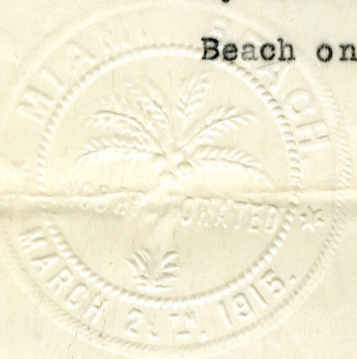
