

ORDINANCE NO. 249

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO
THE COLLECTION OR SALE OF
BOTTLES AND PROVIDING A
PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION
THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH,
FLORIDA:

1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to collect or to sell empty bottles or glass containers which have contained intoxicating liquors or which bear any label indicating that such bottles have contained intoxicating liquor or beer or wine.

2. That any person, firm or corporation found guilty of a violation of this ordinance shall upon conviction be findd not exceeding \$200.00 or be imprisoned in the City Jail not exceeding ninety days.
