## ORDINANCE NO. 270

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA, REQUIRING LANDS TO BE KEPT CLEAN AND PROVIDING FOR LIENS THEREON FOR THE EXPENSE THERE-OF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MIAMI BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: That the owners and occupants of all lands, lots and other premises within the City of Miami Beach, are hereby required to keep same clean, sanitary and free from weeds, trash and debris.

SECTION 2: That if said owners or occupants of said lands within the City of Miami Beach shall fail to comply with the requirements of this Ordinance the City Manager is hereby directed and authorized to cause such work to be done, and keep an account of the cost thereof, whereupon said cost shall be a charge and lien against the property so cleaned, of the same extent and character as liens for special assessments provided in the Charter of said City.
