Yours of the 4th in relation to samples of marl from "59-37" at hand: (if the marl has depth to it a sample from the surface and one from the lowest depth available would be all that is necessary if it is all practically the same thing; the chemist thinks the richest deposits will <sup>be</sup> fartherest from the surface.)

I think it would be desirable to get samples from the township, as we would then know definitely where they came from. You are right to have Mr. McRae establish the north-east corner. I think it would be best to hold up any sale of it until we can find out about this marl.
