Yours of the 2nd inst. at hand. I can get you samples of marl from "59-37", but please advise how many two pound samples will be necessary as it will probably be heavy walking and hard work packing them to the nearest conveyance.

If you should want the marl samples absolutely from this Township, it might be well to have Mr. McRae establish the Northeast corner of the same, as from the different descriptions given by people who claim to have been over it, I have my doubts if any of the investigating parties have been on it, except Mr. Krome.

You will remember that we found a good prairie just south of Long Key, and according to the map which I have, the north boundary of this township is four miles south of Long Key, and the Northeast corner of it would be about four or five miles south of Camp Jackson.

Dr. Enloe has not received reply to his telegram, although he wired the man's wife to forward the same to him as soon as she could ascertain his address.
