Enclosed please find Bill of Biscayne Engineering Company in amount of \$378.60, dated September 15, 1915, on account of Cape Sable Survey. You will note that this bill is O.K'd by F. J. Powers.

Mr. Powers ^{said} ~~told me~~ in the presence of Mr. Brown that he held this bill up for fear Mr. Brown might not have had the time of certain men reported to him by Mr. Robin.

From talking with Mr. Powers, I find that he and Mr. Robin did not get along well together. I have had Brown go over his bill with me and give me the special charges for each day, and am enclosing a memorandum of same as it will help you to understand the bill. I am also enclosing a letter from Mr. Powers to you in which he states that he did not think the Company would have to pay the surveyors for the time they were in camp when not at work.

Mr. Powers' mistake seems to have been not to have provided a suitable camp and other conditions before the arrival of so expensive men as surveyors.
