Dear Sir:

I have received your letter of the 15th inst. from Chuluota in regard to having Mr. Brown withdraw his party from Cape Sable, and also to notify Mr. Powers; also letter from Mr. Harrison of the 15th inst. in re. the same, and your telegram of today in re. the same.

Mr. Tobin, the surveyor in charge, returned home because he did not think it was wise to continue work under the conditions, and I am enclosing, herewith, letter from Mr. Brown, together with a statement of expenses from August 24th to the 14th inst. incl. I have not paid this bill as I have received the enclosed letter from Mr. Powers.

Mr. Brown tells me that when Mr. Tobin left there there had been about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles of old line cut out and $1\frac{1}{8}$ miles of new line run. If you wish to communicate directly with Mr. Powers, I may be able to get a letter of yours through to him on one of the fish boats leaving here for Cape Sable every few days.
