In reply to yours of the 28th ultimo, Mr. W. E. Brown has a young man in his employ who has been working for him for some time, whom he says could do your work alright, except that he, Brown would go down and run the base line for him to work from. Brown is not certain just when he could get away, as he is working for Mr. Fisher across the Bay, but if Mr. Fisher is not coming down here next week, he could get away the first of next week. It seems that Mr. Fisher has been away on a long hunting trip, is returning to his home North and may plan to come down here right away, but his manager here does not know Mr. Fisher plans in that respect until he hears from him.

Mr. Brown would not charge anything for his services but expenses but would charge \$15.00 a day for the services of the surveyor and two men, the Company to provide for the accommodations and board of the men, and the usual expenses.
