Dear Mr. Dooley:

I have your letter of July 9th and am returning, herewith, the plat you enclosed showing part of the route of the Ingraham Highway south of Royal Palm Park.

I called at the County Commissioner's Office to examine the original contract between McGrary Co. and the County Commissioners, to make comparison of this plat and the one attached to the contract, but was informed by the Clerk that the County's copy of this contract has been misplaced and they have so far been unable to locate it; we went through the files and found other papers relating to the subject, but the original contract is missing, and the Clerk states that they will have to depend on McGrary's copy if anything comes up whereby the agreement will need be consulted. In the packet I found one blue print apparently showing the proposed road line, but it bears no date nor indicates by whom it was made, and the Clerk is unable to identify it in connection with any of the agreements; it seemed to show the old original proposed route from Royal Palm Park to Monroe County line; it did not show any faint lines as on the enclosed plat but

showed the sections as being about a mile and quarter north and south.

I called at office of the County Engineer in hopes that he could give me some information, but was informed he was out of town. The first time I can see him, will ask him if he knows anything about it, and let you know.

Write me if I can do anything more.
