Dear Sir:-

Your favor of the 19th inst. addressed to Mr. J. E. Ingraham, has been received in the office during his absence in the Southern part of the State.

The writer has no knowledge of a Mr. King who is representing our Company in the sale of the Cape Sable lands, and as far as I know the Cape Sable Townsite is merely a contemplated one and I don't think it is as yet laid out.

At the present time the nearest point for shipping purposes from Cape Sable would be Long Key or Islamorada, all shipments from Cape Sable having to go by barge or schooner to these points for shipment over the railroad. There is a hard-surfaced road, known as the Ingraham Highway, which is being constructed to open up this country, but it has not yet been completed.

Upon Mr. Ingraham's return I will hand ~~him~~ your letter for further reply.
