Dear Sir,

While at Ft. Lauderdale yesterday I met Mr. A. B. Lowe who is Chairman of the ~~Cou~~ Commissioners of Broward Co. and has been Chairman since the beginning of the county. He told me he was trying to arrange a reduction of the taxes by paying less to the state. He says they have to pay the state 9 mills on the assessment. That now they value property at 50% of its value, but by reducing the percentage of valuation, and increasing the millage the tax payer will have smaller taxes to pay, *as the Comill have less to pay the state*. He mentioned that he was a candidate for Supervisor of the Broward Drainage District, having been a supervisor for the past two years, and that he would like the support of your Company, land owners having a vote for every acre. The election to be held at Ft. Lauderdale on the the 30th of this month. He appears to be a hard working reliable man. Because of your letter of the 19th of May on the Drainage Districts, I asked him a good many questions, especially as to the opposition of Helms, Walker and the Metropolis, to the present supervisors.
