Since our letter to you of April 26th we have talked to Mr. Bernstein on the phone once or twice, at which time he was still making an investigation of these drainage districts for Mr. Garrison, but in phoning him again a day or two ago he stated that Mr. Garrison had instructed him not to draw any Bill to be presented in the Legislature, as his add had stirred up very little interest among property owners of the various taxing districts, and Mr. Bernstein said he was taking no further interest in the matter.

We then phoned Mr. Garrison and he stated a Bill had been put thru the Legislature granting some tax relief for the Dade Drainage District, in which he was principally interested, and he was doing nothing further on any of the other districts.
