Dear Mr. Conrad:

Since our conference a couple of days ago I have gone into the matter of taxes of Southern Drainage District with Mr. J. L. Holmberg, President of the Landowners League, and he informs me that in contacting the principal landowners in the District, it is the consensus of opinion that for the best interests of the District and the landowners, that no drainage district tax should be levied for at least the next couple of years, including the year 1933, and, therefore, Mr. Holmberg, as President of the Landowners League, is writing you a letter requesting that the Supervisors prepare and submit to the convening Legislature, such a bill as will authorize the Supervisors to leave off any tax for the years 1933 and 1934 and possibly 1935, which will be the next Legislature meeting year after this.

As I informed you, Mr. J. W. Hoffman, Vice-President of the Model Land Company and Perrine Grant Land Company represents a considerable acreage in your District, and he feels this is the proper thing to do and joins in with the balance of the landowners in making the request being made by Dr. Holmberg as President.

If this office or any of our connections can be of any service to you in having such a measure passed we will be pleased to have you call upon us, and if convenient, I would appreciate it if you would send us a copy of such a measure as the Supervisors will request.
