RE: Meeting of Land Owners
Southern Drainage Dis.

Replying to your letter concerning the meeting of land owners at Miami, Monday the 14th instant, my understanding is that this is the nature of a conference to consider what steps the land owners would take in the matter of the survey being carried on by the trustees of the lands in the district, with a probably suggestion to the Board of Supervisors that the matter of collecting taxes and proceeding with the reclamation plan be deferred until the matter of the survey can be determined.

My impression is that Mr. Morse can attend the meeting and report the result of the proceedings covering the points that will be of interest to the Company without my attending the meeting. I am not sufficiently advised of the purpose of the meeting to know of any particular course that should be pursued at the meeting and for this reason deem it advisable to merely participate in the meeting to the extent of ascertaining the views of the land owners present and would prefer to consider a report of the proceedings unless there is some new development in the meeting.
