The Southern Frainage District Landowner's League
met this day on call.

After the reading of the minutes of the last meeting
the plats and plans of the Southern Drainage District were
discussed.

The following resolution was passed and adopted.

Whereas the work of the dredge now excavating the
cut-off canal from the Tamiami Trail Canal and the Miami
Canal will be finished by the first of next month and it
appears to the Landowners League of the Southern Drainage
District that it will be greatly beneficial to the lands
adjacent to the cut-off canal and the east end of the
Tamiami Trail Canal now under continuation empty directly
into the Tamiami Trail and open up that canal to tide water.

Therefore be it Resolved by the Landowners's League
of the Southern Drainage District that the Supervisors of the
Southern Drainage District request the chief Engineer of the
State and the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund to
instruct the contractors to cut the canal now under construction
directly into the Tamiami Trail Canal.

Be it further Resolved that the Southern Drainage
District, if possible, should allow the dredge now working
to continue and excavate the Tamiami Trail Canal to the
width called for by the Plan of Reclamation expending the tax
money now available, as such work will save several thousand
dollars to the District, as the Dredge is now available.

That the Landowner's League of the Southern Drainage
Fistrict hereby goes on record as advising all landowners who
have not paid their 1918 Installment tax to pay same at once
as they are satisfied that said money will be spent for the
direct benefit of the lands.

The Secretary was instructed to forward a copy of
the above resolution to the Board of Supervisors of the
Southern Drainage District and also to the Trustees of the
Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida.

Mr. J. D. Redd called the attention of the League
to the condition of Snapper Creek Canal, and after discussion
of same, it was moved, seconded and passed:

That a committee be appointed to investigate condi-
tions on Snapper Creek Canal, and report to next meeting of the
League.

The Chairman appointed as the committee, F. O. Bendle,
D. J. Redd and J. L. Holmberg.

There being no further business to come before the
League same adjourned till Monday, July 21, 1919, at 3 o'clock
P. M.
