Senate passed bill recommended by landowners meeting of June 10th last night, said bill directs our Board to not levy a tax for 1930.

We would appreciate it if you and Young and Chappell will pass it through the house.

These raw lands bear a tax of three dollars per acre, average, per year and the present market price on these lands is from five to ten dollars per acre, which means that if something is not done to lower the taxes, these lands will go back to the district and state and come off the tax books entirely anyway.

The large land owners can hope for no relief from the county and state because of the bond issues, but as our district has never issued any bonds and has no indebtedness we can stand the rap and yet make a fair showing in drainage work.

As this will lower taxes for the year 1930 on 144000 acres of land in Dade County I feel sure we may depend on the support of you all.
