We have your letter of Oct. 10, 1919, in re having Mr. Livingston do some temporary work in 58 - 38 in regard to the advisability of drainage.

I wrote Mr. Krome for a map of levels he had made in 58-38 and am enclosing you a blue print of the same.

Mr. Krome writes me, " I am sending you by this mail a tracing showing surface elevations and depths to rock for several miles to the west of the track between Florida City and Everglades Water Station. You will note that levels are referred to F. E. C. datum and I may add that mean low water in Barnes Sound so referred to the same datum would be about Elevation 101.3."

I judge that this map will make it unnecessary for Mr. Livingston to make this preliminary survey in 58-38, and if you think so please advise me that I may write him not to make the same.

From the levels in the map ordinary drainage does not seem practicable.
