Dear Sir:

Mr. L. W. Loudon, mailing address, Box 764, Homestead, Florida, but who lives at Cape Sable and states he has been a resident of that section for the past 20 years, called in this morning to solicit the aid of the Motel Land Company in getting the County Commissioners of Monroe County to repair a bridge on the Cape Sable Road, the bridge in question being over the canal at the forks of the road about a mile South of the Dade-Monroe County line.

Mr. Loudon states that the piling or bents of the bridge are giving away and that it is already in a dangerous condition and no doubt in a short while will fall in. He states he and other citizens have at times in the past made requests for small repairs to the road, etc., but nothing has ever been done, and it was his idea that if the matter of putting this bridge in repair was taken up by the Motel Land Company, results would be obtained. It is his opinion that the work at this time would not cost over \$50.00 and would save the bridge and possibly a serious accident to someone attempting to cross the bridge with a car, not knowing its condition, and further, if it is not attended to soon and allowed to run along until it falls in the canal it will be a total loss and cost a great deal more for replacement than repair at this time.

We promised Mr. Loudon we would communicate his request to you and advise him of what, if any results you could get.
