Dear Mr. Coffrin:

A number of years ago the Perrine Grant Land Co. put out a number of rubber trees on the Perrine Grant, scattered about, some in every section of the grant. I don't know how many hundred were put out, but there were a good many, which we had a good deal of trouble in getting through the help of Mr. Fairchild of the Department, where they were located by Mr. Burgham of Augusta, Ga.

I am anxious to get photographs showing the growth of these trees and the location, and am now convinced that growing rubber on a commercial scale can be safely undertaken in Dade County, provided labor conditions would permit. I will appreciate any information on the subject you can get. You might talk this over with Mr. Livingston of the Chamber of Commerce, and see if he has something on the subject.

I propose when I get your reply and the photographs and information desired to take it up with the Manufacturers' Board, with whom I have already had some discussion of the subject.
