Replying to your inquiry of the 19th inst. and returning, herewith, newspaper article regarding a new proposed Drainage District to be known as "Biscayne Drainage District".

We do not know of any property owned by your Company at this time that this proposed district would take in. It affects principally lands of the Curtis-Bright Ranch Co., A. M. Griffing and Mr. C. F. Haworth to whom you sold about 2,000 acres about a year ago.

While I have been away I find, however, that the Pennsylvania Sugar Company are favoring and agitating a larger district which would take in this same territory and others and extend west through their property to the Miami Canal, and a general meeting of those interested has been called in the Chamber of Commerce hall for next Monday afternoon the 30th inst. It may be if the proposed enlarged plan is approved that some of your properties will be affected.

I expect to be present at this meeting and will make you a further report.
