Dear Sir:-

This will acknowledge receipt of your favor of the 23rd inst., expressing regrets that you were unable to be present at the meeting of the Supervisors and property owners of both the Biscayne and Dade Drainage Districts, held in my office this afternoon.

After the general meeting there was a meeting held of the property owners and Supervisors of the Biscayne Drainage District to take up the matter of your request that you be relieved as Attorney for the Biscayne Drainage District, as set forth in the first part of your letter. Regrets were expressed by the property owners that you felt it necessary to be relieved of this work, but, as they felt that you were sincere in this request and it being their desire to accommodate you, a motion was duly made and carried by the property owners that they recommend to the Board of Supervisors the acceptance of your resignation under the terms and conditions as set forth in your letter. This resolution was acted upon favorably by the Board of Supervisors and you are, therefore, hereby notified that your resignation has been accepted as of this date.

I take pleasure in advising further that the property owners unanimously passed a resolution expressing their appreciation of the services rendered by you in the past, in which expressions, the Board of Supervisors also wished to join.

Your offer to cooperate with or render any assistance you can to your successor is greatly appreciated, as is also, your agreement that upon acceptance of your resignation it is understood that you are to make no charge for services thus far rendered for the Biscayne Drainage District, other than an amount

of about \$455.00, which has up to this time been paid to you by the different property owners involved in the district.

We are pleased to have your recommendation that either Mr. W. I. Evans or Mr. J. P. Simons be appointed as your successor, and for your information will state that the appointment was offered to and accepted by Mr. Evans. Mr. Simons gave as his opinion that if even though he desired to do so, he could not legally take up this work. Mr. Evans will no doubt later call upon you for information, especially as to what has transpired up to this time and we will appreciate it very much if you will give him such assistance as you can.
