Dear Sir:

Following our letter of the 29th instant, on above subject, we now quote for your information, a letter received from Mr. J. M. Holferty under date of January 29th:

"Referring to our experimental plot of sugar cane. There were sixteen varieties planted by Mr. C. P. Sheffield on Sept. 20th, 1930 and these plots were fertilized in Nov. by Dr. G. B. Sartoris, Pathologist in charge of the Canal Point Station with a 5-8-5 mixture of commercial fertilizer with 200 lbs. of manganese sulphate added to each ton of commercial.

The cane seems to be doing well and all plots are growing. I regret that I was unable to give you this data when you were here yesterday and trust this will reach you in time to hand to Mr. Hoffman."
