Dear Sir:

When the news came out recently that the Bill proposing the establishment of the Everglades National Park in the State of Florida, had been approved and enacted into law in Washington, we wrote to Senator Fletcher, requesting that he send us a copy of the Bill so that we could see what it contained, being especially interested in the area and boundaries of the proposed Park.

We are just in receipt of a few copies of this Bill and are sending a couple of them herewith to you in case you have not seen it.

It appears from the contents of the Bill that it involves a maximum area of 2000 square miles, with the boundaries and final area to be selected, left to the judgment of the Secretary of the Interior; therefore, the Bill itself does not give us very much information.

If you happen to have any further information as to what might happen we would be pleased to have it in order that we may be kept posted to meet any further inquiries which may come up.
