My dear Mrs. Stranaha:

I have not heard from you since I wrote you after Mrs. Sniffen's visit; but I write this morning to know if you expect to go to New York City to the Biennial, and are we going to carry out the wishes of a great many of the National organization women, and have our Seminole Resolutions presented?

I would like to hear from you regarding this, because to have them endorsed by the Florida delegation is all that will be necessary to have them passed, as I am hearing from all over the country now -- from Washington as well as other organizations -- and they are asking that the Florida women keep the subject before the public.

We now have Washington City cooperating with us, and the legality of all Everglade lands may be questioned if the matter continues as it has been doing for the last seventeen years, since the Secretary of the Interior and the Indian Inspector recommended lands after an expensive survey made by the United States Government.
