My dear Mrs. Wilson:

I believe I omitted to say in my letter to you from Washington that the Assistant Commissioner of Indian Affairs - Mr. Merritt, declared that if the Seminoles were in distress, he would see that they were speedily relieved. A good promise. We find that unless some individual has time and money to spend in righting wrongs protracted upon Indians that conditions are rarely bettered.

Just now great pressure is being brought to bear upon the Indian office, and now is the time to do things for the Seminoles, in my judgment. If you need legal advice, Mr. Tom L. Sloan the attorney for the Society of American Indians will be glad to furnish it.
