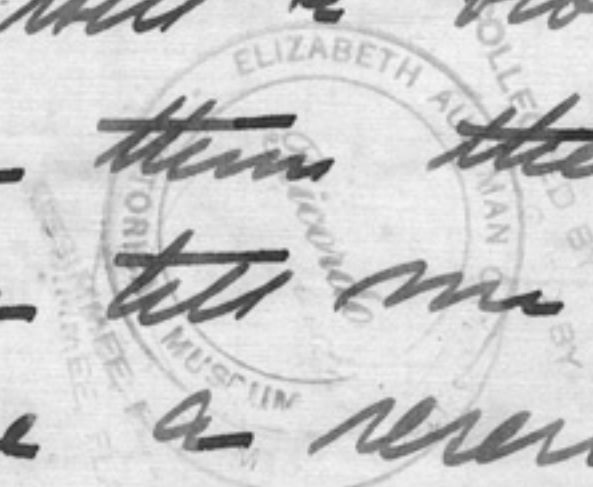
I have been asked by
