If Prof. Rickards sent you an Indian, he would very likely be Tony B.M. Tammie, - I believe I would prefer either of these I have mentioned above, for your purpose.

Charlie Tiger Tail of the big Cypress I am acquainted with. You might also reach him at Everglade post office, through the post master. I met Charlie at Ft. Myers the year the Press Association met there, - took him to dinner with me at the hotel and later arranged to get a picture of Vice. President Marshall and Charlie - shaking hands. Probably the photographer at Ft. Myers has the picture yet.

Should you succeed in getting an Indian, I would be interested in a report from you later.
