Glenn, who for four years was Presbyterian pastor of the church at Everglades, who has been among the Indians for part of each year, and who has the unqualified backing of the Collier interests where he worked and where most of the Seminoles now live.

I trust the booklet which you so kindly loaned me has at last been returned to you (Mrs. Nash said she was mailing it from Winter Park); and also that you have received a copy of my Seminole report, being sent out by Senator Fletcher.
