My dear Mrs. Wilson,

I was very happy indeed to receive your letter yesterday dated May 17th and I am hastening to answer you. I wish with all my heart that it were possible to send you a good big fat check but as that is out of the question these days, I am going to help you in another way if I can. 61

I believe it will be a very wise thing for you to write to Mrs. Roosevelt and tell her of your historical research work under the C.W. A. Will you let me suggest that you make the letter as short as possible, and that it be typed? Mrs. Roosevelt is very deeply interested in all history of our country and if she possibly can do so I am sure she will help you to a position to do your share to working on the history of Florida. You certainly have proven your knowledge and capacity to present the results of such a study with interest. 18

Another suggestion I want to make is that you will have some friend of yours in Kissimmee or in your county, write to Mrs. Roosevelt and tell her of your work and also of your need. When this is done and when you give me the name of the lady who writes to Mrs. Roosevelt, I will be very glad to write to her also. I know Mrs. Roosevelt very happily but it is my sister Mary Dreier of New York City who is her friend. If you have two friends who will write on your behalf to Mrs. Roosevelt, that will be better than just one letter, but I would not have too many letters sent. I hope with all my heart that you will receive the position for all of us in Florida are keen to know the history of the land we love so much.
