Mrs. Wilson since her residence in Florida has become
a national figure, her work for the former Seminoles
of the Everglades has been a most difficult one
because handicapped by the graft of politicians

homeless Seminole Indians were granted 100,000
acres in the Everglades by the Florida Legislature
This victory is regarded as the greatest single
piece of work ever done in Florida and in this victory
which was the ending of a long fought labor of love

and Justice has made Mrs. ^{name} Wellons, known throughout
America. †

She is the author of "The Seminoles of Florida", the only
authentic publication on the Everglades Seminoles.
Mrs. Wellons is now in New York City at the Hotel
Imperial, where she is launching a campaign, by which
Florida will give another 10,000 acres in the
Everglades, as a Memorial Sanctuary, to be used as
a home for the wild life - the migrating birds of
the whole North American Continent, for Florida's
native birds - for the forest creatures - and a rendezvous
for the Seminole Indians.
