Your favor of the 1st instant, with enclosure, received. Yes, the "fine Italian hand" of Jennings is seen in that communication from the chairman of the Legislation Department of the Federation. However, we have been expecting something of that sort all along, so we are not disappointed.

The Legislature convened today and organized, but it is not likely that any bills will be introduced before tomorrow.

Mr. Bryan has our bill and he will present it to the House. Assuming that he is to be on the Indian Committee, he said that when there was a hearing on the matter, he wanted us present. I don't know at this writing when that hearing will be held, but it seems to me that at least some of you ought to attend. I will advise you so soon as it is arranged for. The Committees will be announced probably tomorrow, and then we can see how far Speaker Hardee has accepted our suggestions.

Senator J. E. Alexander, of DeLand Co., will introduce our bill in his branch. Governor Catts named him as a good man for the work.

We have made a good start, and from now on it will be a case of "watchful waiting" and constant nudging.
